- 1. In lines 1-43, Douglass tells the story of an early encounter with Mr. Covey. What details from the passage tell you that Mr. Covey is a cruel man?
- 2. Reread lines 44-52. What was it like for a slave working on the Covey Plantation. Cite details from the text to support your answer.
- 3. Which of Douglass's details do you find to be the most powerful? Cite specific lines or paragraphs with the text and explain what that portion is so powerful.
- 4. In what ways is this selection persuasive? Who is Douglass's intended audience? What is the persuasive point that Douglass is trying to get across. Cite text evidence to support your answer.
- 5. Who is Douglass's audience? Cite at least two examples of Douglass's diction that are specifically for this audience. Then explain how these examples prove both his purpose and his audience.
- 6. What is Douglass's tone? Cite at least two text examples that reveal this tone. How does Douglass's tone relate to his purpose?
